

## Opening Times and Prices

The Musical Museum is open for groups Tuesday to Sunday each week from 11.00 – 16.30. Group entry is charged at £7.50 per head inclusive of a tour guide and tea/coffee & biscuits. Minimum numbers 20. Smaller groups can often be accommodated on some weekdays and at weekends.

## *A hidden gem in West London*

Step back a hundred years or more and enter the magical world of automatic music. In the era before microphones, an amazing range of instruments was invented to bring the works of the great composers into homes, great and small, and the cafes of the day.

A group visit to the museum centres around live presentations of instruments including delicate musical boxes, reproducing pianos, organs and self-playing violins. You will be fascinated by the intricate workings and amazing sound of an orchestrion that recreates the world of a concert orchestra.

No tour is ever the same, the questions you ask, the stories you laugh at and the memories that you bring to the event creates a fresh experience every time. Our tour guides are highly experienced and will enjoy taking your group on an exciting journey.

Most groups like to spend between 90 minutes and 2 hours for a visit to the Museum. This allows time for a tour of the galleries and free time to explore further. The gift shop is popular with group visitors for its range of musical themed gifts, CDs books and cards.

## *The Wurlitzer Experience*

The Mighty Wurlitzer is one of the stars of the collection. The theatre organ, imported from America in the 1920s, rises from beneath the stage as it did in the Golden Age of Cinema. Let your group sit back and listen to music from stage and screen while enjoying some light refreshments.

### *Refreshments*

Group visits includes a break for tea/coffee and biscuits. The museum offers additional catering options including a range of light lunches and afternoon tea and is fully licensed. Groups wishing to have lunch or afternoon tea should pre-book and pay in advance.

Established nearly fifty years ago, the museum re-opened in a new purpose building in 2007. It is spacious and has full disabled access to all public areas of the building and disabled parking and toilets.

## *Make the trip a full day out*

If you would like to organise a full day trip a visit to the Musical Museum may be combined with a visit to another local attraction, such as Syon House, Marble Hill House or to Kew Bridge Steam Museum with whom the Museum has a combined joint visit rate.
