THE MUSICAL MUSEUM

The Musical Museum contains one of the world's foremost collections of automatic musical instruments. From a tiny clockwork Musical Box to the 'Mighty Wurlitzer', and a comprehensive array of sophisticated reproducing pianos.

The collection was originally assembled in St George's Church, Brentford by the late Frank Holland M.B.E. in 1963. It became a Charitable Trust in 1966 with the objective of preserving the collection so that it could be demonstrated to future generations, educating them in the way that music was recorded before the days of broadcasting and good quality gramophone records.

The Musical Museum is now a Company Limited by Guarantee with Charitable Status and is registered with the Museums and Galleries Commission.

The Museum is run by Volunteers who perform a wide range of tasks including instrument restoration and giving conducted tours of the collection. The day to day running costs are met solely from the income generated by admission charges and sales from the Museum Shop which together with a variety of ad-hoc grants from various institutions enable the Museum to continue.

THE FRIENDS OF THE MUSICAL MUSEUM

The Friends of The Musical Museum was formed in 1987 to bring together the many individuals who wished to support the Museum. Our aim is to provide support for The Musical Museum and to assist in educating the public in the design, development and history of keyboard instruments generally and of automatic musical instruments.

The Friends assist the Museum by fund-raising events and by providing Volunteers who staff the Museum when open to the public. We also arrange educational visits to other similar institutions and occasionally promote concerts and lectures of general interest. Every year the Friends arrange at least one informal event in The Musical Museum, where members have the opportunity to listen and learn about the extensive collection.

The Friends of The Musical Museum is a separate registered charity and is a member of The British Association of Friends of Museums (BAFM).
